And, Great River Regional Library will be showing patrons young and old just how accessible the process of coding actually is during the Hour of Code program.

The Hour of Code is an internationally-recognized movement designed to make the concepts of computer science appealing to everyone including young children – in as little as one hour.

With this in mind, throughout the week of Dec. 4-10, Great River branches will be stocked with 7 passive programs, 4 kits (including LEGOs & snap circuits) 4 circulating games and staff on-hand to assist.

Each branch of Great River will have their own unique assortment of these coding games, books and activities. Patrons are encouraged to stop by their branch of GRRL any time during open hours to learn more and try them out.

Stargazing in Buffalo

The Buffalo branch of Great River Regional Library is now the home of an Orion StarBlast Reflector telescope, available for checkout with an adult library card.

The telescope is the brainchild of retiree and Buffalo Rotary Club member Mark Boyd.

The offering is the first of its kind at Great River Regional Library – and in Minnesota in general – but Boyd says telescopes are a proven library success story in states such as New Hampshire.

Once he had the idea, Boyd, an avid astronomy enthusiast with his own home observatory, worked with the Rotary Club of Buffalo to secure the funding for the device.

Once the telescope arrived in Buffalo, Boyd took time to teach library staff the ins and outs of using the complex device.

While Boyd is preparing to spend the winter in warmer climes, he is committed to making himself reachable by phone and email to help staff and patrons with their telescope questions.

It seems likely they'll be taking him up on this.

Buffalo Library manager Amy Wittmann says the telescope has already become a popular item with library users. It's currently out on a three-week checkout, and names are beginning to populate the waiting list.

Boyd says his goal is to see a telescope in every branch of Great River Regional Library, and he'd like to help make that a reality.

"The more we can embed this with kids, the better off we will be as a society."

GRRL2GO Locker System Opens in Sartell

The new center is now fully-loaded with a 44-locker system, a payment kiosk for fines and renewals and a book drop.

Library users have been busily making their item requests, which are dropped off every Tuesday. Materials are picked up from the book drop Tuesday-Friday.

Anyone with a Great River library card is free to use *GRRL2GO*.

GRRL2GO is the first Bibliotheca locker system in Minnesota and was made possible through a partnership between Great River Regional Library and the City of Sartell.

St. Cloud Public Library selected for first-of-itskind internship



his summer, St. Cloud Public Library was one of 35 libraries nation wide to receive a Public Library Association (PLA) grant – paid, mentored internship for 52 high school juniors and seniors from diverse backgrounds.

That's how Debraha Omot, a 2017 Apollo High School graduate, was able to spend the summer at the library helping plan activities.

Debraha, in partnership with nonprofit organization Hands Across the World, planned and held a 6-week story and craft program for children. She also assisted with the library's inaugural Summer Meals program in tandem with the YES Network.

In June, Debraha and mentor/ St. Cloud librarian Kate Buechler traveled to Washington, D.C. to meet 52 other interns from 25 states. And, after the internship ended, they went to Chicago to present on and discuss the summer with other PLA interns.

Axis 360 - GRRL's Newest Digital Library Addition

reat River Regional Library e-book and e-audiobook fans will soon have a new way to find what they're looking for.

Axis 360, an e-materials platform, will be added to the Great River lineup alongside current platform OverDrive as part of our digital library.

Over the summer, Great River staff reviewed and compared several digital media options, and ultimately chose Axis 360. Here are a few of the reasons why:

- Axis 360 is affordable; it will allow us to devote more money into purchasing new materials instead of paying high annual fees.
- Axis 360 has a strong commitment to patron privacy; Axis 360 doesn't require you to create new credentials to access your materials. It also doesn't share library user information in order to promote its services.
- Axis 360 has a great reputation as an ADAaccessible system. In fact, it was developed with the help of the National Federation for the Blind.

Axis 360 is compatible with most devices, with the exception of Kindle Paperwhites/E Ink readers and first/second generation Kindle Fires. Users of those devices will still have the opportunity to download their materials via OverDrive.

The service will be rolled out to the entire GRRL region at the beginning of 2018. Feedback from users will be crucial and will help us determine which programs and services to use in the future.

Great River Regional Library is the first library system in the state of Minnesota to use Axis 360. Watch for announcements in the next few weeks related to the rollout!

It's Your Lucky Day...

Through your generous donations, GRRL is excited to announce the launch of the "Lucky Day" collection, which features the most popular books from your favorite authors, available immediately for checkout.

Seven libraries are part of the pilot program: Foley, Big Lake, Cokato, Kimball, Swanville, Long Prairie, and Pierz. Each will receive a starter collection of 20 items. Each month through March 2018 the participating libraries will select/receive 4 additional titles/ month. Items are no holds, no renewals, one week checkout, limit of two per library card. The titles will not appear in the public catalog - patrons will need to visit our library buildings to access this new collection.

The books are labeled with a shamrock spine label sticker and a sticker on the front with the loan terms.
