Changing world, changing libraries; National Library Week 2017

his year's National Library Week, April 9-15, took a close look at the ways libraries have adapted over time to meet the shifting needs of individuals and communities, as well as how the histories and legacies of community libraries are preserved and celebrated.

Around the region, members of the GRRL staff and patrons took the time to create displays that highlight the rich histories of each branch and shine a light on exactly how libraries are moving into the future.

Jan Atkinson, Library Services Coordinator in Melrose, says the addition of technology fundamentally changed the ways in which libraries assist patrons.

"Since moving into this building, we have automated our system, offered internet service and Wi-Fi," Jan says."The latest service is self-checkout."

Technology isn't the only thing transitioning; the changing cultural fabric of Minnesota's communities has had an influence. "We now offer Spanish language materials for the Hispanic population," Jan says. "They love our DVD collection."

Wanda Erickson, Library Services Coordinator from Upsala says, for all the ways that libraries have changed, there are some things that are simply timeless, as shown in this testimonial from a longtime Upsala Public Library patron.

"The rural library I had access to as a kid was a lifeline for me, a way to see what the world was like outside my little pocket of existence. I can't imagine how stunted I would have grown up to become without it in my life. I know that today most of us have access to the Internet at our fingertips, but that doesn't negate the value that libraries, particularly ones in rural areas, have to fostering a vibrant, intelligent community."

Wanda writes, "He is one of ours, an Upsala boy who was a 'library kid,' who grew up coming to the library and relishing every minute. I am so very proud of him and all the 'library kids' this branch has fostered over the past 30 years!"





So, in keeping with this theme, we've got a diverse offering of programs for ages 0-18. From LEGOs and wire sculpture design to hands-on exhibits on wildlife and building electrical circuits, the goal of this year's Summer Reading Program is to show how much fun learning is...all year long.

Read Down Fines

reat River Library will be offering another opportunity to "Read Down Your Fines" this summer.



This event is geared toward kids ages 16 and younger who are unable to borrow library materials due to outstanding fines. This program helps them restore their borrowing privileges simply by reading at the library.

Here's how it works: for every 15 minutes a kid spends reading a book or magazine at their local library, they reduce their fines by \$1. The average reader shaves \$5 off their fines during the event.

The next Read Down Your Fines event will take place Monday, June 26 through Saturday, July 1 all throughout GRRL.

Read Down Your Fines can only be applied to fines for late return of library materials. It doesn't cover fees related to damaged or lost items.
