Meet Jonathan, Great River Regional Library's Web Developer. Since Jonathan joined GRRL as a staff member back in 2019, he has contributed so much to the library. Not only has he shown his skills in the Information Technology (IT) department, he has also supported the library as a generous donor.

# When asked why he supports the library through giving, his response was this:

When I was young, my mom used to get books from the library and she would always encourage my brother and me to read. It led me to adopting a good reading habit and helped my academics. In college, the library gave me access to free educational resources that I wouldn't be able to get elsewhere. It wasn't until I was out of college did I realize the impact the library had on my life and career. Once I started working at the library, I got to see the wider impact it had on the people in the community. I wanted to be involved in giving back in the same way it gave to me. Beyond being GRRL staff and a generous donor, Jonathan is also a user of the library. He accesses the digital library the most, checking out ebooks on the Libby app. **His latest book recommendations are** "The Song of Achilles" by Madeline Miller, "Where the Crawdads Sing" by Delia Owens, and "The Lincoln Lawyer" by Michael Connelly.

#### What are Playaway Audiobooks?

March marks the library's Locally Growin' annual fundraiser. Local library staff determines a goal that meets their community's needs and interests. The community then has the opportunity to show their library support, and 100% of their donation stays local.

# Playaway Audiobooks was a popular goal in 2022 for many of the Great River Regional Library branches.

Libraries in Albany, Cokato, Little Falls, Melrose, Paynesville, Swanville, and Waite Park saw this collection item to be an important addition for their patrons. These specific audiobooks are not circulated regionally within the collection, so you cannot find them in the library's catalog. However, they are a unique item for checkout at local branches where available.

What are Playaway Audiobooks? According to playaway. com, "Playaway is the pre-loaded audiobook that gives library patrons the portability and freedom to take audiobooks everywhere. No connectivity or downloads needed — ever." The handheld device has your audiobook already loaded, so all you have to do is press play.

John Hannon, Library Services Coordinator in Albany and Melrose, explained why Playaway Audiobooks are great to have in the collection:

For all patrons, they have the benefit of [Playaway Audiobooks] being a standalone player; no specific device is needed to use them. With the auxiliary cable that is included they can be plugged into any speaker, sound system or car with an auxiliary port. Or patrons can use their own headphones or earbuds. With fewer and fewer cars being built with CD players, Playaways will allow patrons who like to listen to audiobooks while driving the ability to do so without paying extra for a different sound system. They also eliminate one of my biggest problems with audiobooks while driving, I get where I'm going and want to keep listening, but if I eject the disc I need to get back to the same spot. With books on CD I end up sitting in my garage listening to the end of the disc. With Playaways, I can just pause the book, unplug the auxiliary cable and go inside. When I plug it into a speaker, or attach my earbuds, I just hit play again and it resumes at the same point I left off.

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Kateri Gruber, Library Services Coordinator in Belgrade and Paynesville, seeks to help a specific community group:

Besides general patron usage, we are hoping the adult Playaway items will be beneficial to our assisted living/nursing home groups that frequently pick up large print books for their clients.

In October and November 2021 Great River Regional Library announced to donors its plan to go "Fines Free" in 2022. The 2021 Year-End Campaign was the first release of the big news, and GRRL wanted to share with its donors first! Why? Library donors are the reason we can reduce the financial barrier of access to the library!

Thank you to all who participated in the 2021 Year-End Campaign – it was a huge success! Our goal for the campaign was \$75,000, and with your help, we reached \$87,724 from 765 donations.

Karen Pundsack, Executive Director of Great River Regional Library, shared, "We have seen so many people return to the library this year because we removed this barrier to access. One of our shared challenges across the region is transportation, and removing fines allows people the flexibility they need to return materials to the library

when they are able to. I am grateful for the support of our dedicated donors who have helped make this change possible." GRRL is excited to welcome more people into the library and reengage after being isolated with the pandemic.
