

New Play2Learn Toy Collection in Paynesville



The Paynesville Library has a new collection named Play2Learn, which is ready for caregivers to check out! This collection was made possible with a generous \$500 donation from the Paynesville Lions Club.

In 2019, Bill Spooner, a Paynesville Lion's Club member, shared an idea with Gretchen Vork, the previous Library Services Coordinator, about creating a toy library where people could check out toys and take them home. Though the initial response was positive, the project was put on hold after Gretchen passed away in early 2020 and the pandemic hit. It wasn't until late 2021 that the Paynesville library staff revisited the concept. Kateri Gruber, the current Library Services Coordinator, collaborated with Bill and Connie Laing, a children's librarian at Great River Regional Library, to further develop the idea. They decided to offer toys that promote learning through play and provide help to caregivers in supporting children's academic, social, and emotional development. Each of the 19 toys comes with an activity sheet highlighting the skills the toy is designed to develop, tips for everyday learning, and suggestions for interaction and

conversation between caregivers and children. These suggestions are intended to encourage children's exploration, reflection, and discovery while using the toys.

While a few other Great River Regional Library locations offer unique items for checkout, like ukuleles or snowshoes, this is the first Play2Learn toy collection available for checkout. Play2Learn kits have also expanded to the libraries in Buffalo, Eagle Bend, and Staples with the help of their Locally Growin' fundraiser. The kits are first-come, first-serve, and available for a one-week checkout.

Although the materials and programs have changed over the years to meet the unique needs of central Minnesota, the heart of the library remains the same: we improve the culture of literacy.


At our core, we seek to increase literacy skills and reading among community members.
